Brafa is...

Brussels Art Fair. Created in 1956, is one of the world's oldest and most prestigious art fairs, famous for the high quality fine art, antiques, and modern and contemporary art and design.

When?

The fair stretches over 9 days, from the end of January to the beginning of February. The first major art event of the year, it is considered a reliable barometer of the art market.

Where?

Brafa is located in Tour & Taxis, a magnificent site that is part of Brussels' industrial heritage. The cosmopolitan capital of Europe is known for its excellent food and dazzling array of museums, monuments and boutique shops.

The fair is only

- :: 10 minutes from the lively centre of Brussels: the UNESCO listed Grand-Place, the chic antique district the Sablon, the trendy fashion area Dansaert, fabulous restaurants...
- :: 15 minutes from the best museums (BOZAR, Cinquantenaire Museum, Royal Museums of Fine Arts of Belgium, Magritte Museum, Horta Museum, Belgian Comic Strip Center, Wiels Contemporary Art Centre...)
- :: 25 minutes from Brussels-Zaventem airport
- :: 2 hours from London, 1 hour 22 minutes from Paris, 1 hour 50 minutes from Amsterdam and 35 minutes from Antwerp

Who?

Brafa admits 135 leading international art and antiques dealers to exhibit at the fair.

What makes Brafa so famous?

Brafa's exhibitor selection process is rigorous, and all objects are verified by an international committee of experts before the fair opens its doors to the public. This enables visitors to buy with the greatest confidence.

Brafa is an exceptional showcase of high quality and rare pieces dating from the Bronze Age to the present day, spanning about 5000 years of history. The fair attracts major art collectors, new buyers, and art lovers curious to see what is on the market.

The fair is known for its welcoming atmosphere, eclecticism and elegance. Brafa's size means you can get a good impression of the fair in a few hours, leaving you lots of time to linger over your favourite pieces!

Why is Brafa more than a fair?

Brafa is not only an art fair: it is also an event devoted to the promotion of art in all its forms, and every year it hosts a special exhibition commissioned by a guest of honour: an important museum or cultural institution. Brafa also presents a series of free art talks given by internationally renowned curators, experts and collectors. Over the years, Brafa has become one of the most inspiring international art fairs and a favoured meeting place for all those involved or interested in the art world.

Why visit Brafa?

As Harold t'Kint de Roodenbeke, the Chairman of Brafa says:

'First and foremost, to discover top level galleries and dealers, and to explore, through their objects – which stretch from ancient archaeological finds to modernday creations – the development and diversity of art. Brafa is in a way an ephemeral museum – the one difference being that everything on show is for sale! These ten days are a high point of the year for collectors and exhibitors, offering a prime opportunity to make new contacts and discuss new projects.

Our ambition is to offer the best in an extremely wide range of fields. We must be able to exceed the expectations of confirmed collectors with very specific knowledge and requirements while encouraging art lovers to start a collection or buy a piece of art. The range of objects on offer is addressed to these different sectors of the public; alongside museum-quality works which are on sale at correspondingly high prices, we offer more accessible pieces which are ideal for starting a collection or just succumbing to an impulse!

Brafa in numbers

- :: 1 major press and promotion campaign is organized in 10 countries : Belgium & Luxemburg, France, Germany, Great Britain, Italy, Russia, Spain, Switzerland, the Netherlands, the USA and the Far East
- :: 1 VIP Program enables special guests to discover Brussels' artistic and cultural treasures, offering exclusive curator-led presentations with private receptions in museums and art centres, visits of Belgian private collections guided by the collectors themselves, and preferential hotels rates


